Ranking points based on a player's result in a tournament;

- Champion awarded ranking points in the "Champion" row
- Player reaching the "FIC Round of 32 (48th Place)" receives the ranking points in that row.
- Withdrawals, walkovers, retirements, defaults, and disqualifications count as wins.
- Byes only count as wins if the player wins their next round.
- A player must win at least one round to receive ranking points in a tournament.

National Compass Draw Level 1 (Table #1A)

This Point Table is used for the Compass Draw singles events USTA Boys' & Girls' 14 & 12 National Championships (Level 1) and the USTA National Doubles Championships (Level 1).

Compass Draw Examples: The players who advance in the East Draw earn the Main Draw ranking points. Wins in all other draws earn the points for winning consolation rounds. For example, at a USTA National Championship, a Level 1 tournament, a player who loses their first round, but then wins three non-East Draw matches earns:

0 points (from East Draw)
 +63 points (for 3 consolation wins - 63 points x 3)
 =189 total Ranking Points for the tournament

USTA BG 14s & 16s Intersectional Team and BG 18s National Team Championships - Level 1 (Table #3)

Ranking Points earned are based on the position a player is on a team. For example, if a player in Position #1 on the team has four singles match wins the player will earn 680 total Ranking Points for the tournament (170 points x 4 wins).

USTA Zone Team Championships - Level 2 (Table #4)

Ranking Points earned are based on the position a player is on a team. For example, if a player in Position #1 on the team has four wins the player will earn 400 total Ranking Points for the tournament (100 points x 4 wins).

How Ranking Works

1. General Rule: A player's top **8 singles results** and top **8 doubles results** are combined to create the player's singles ranking. One clarification: only 25% of the doubles points count toward a player's singles rank. These top 16 scores will come from the player's results over a 12-month period. It is a "rolling 12-month period," meaning if a tournament was played 13 months ago, the points garnered from that tournament would not count.

2. Playing Up: If a 12-year-old plays up in the 14s the earned points count toward both the 12s and 14s ranking. To prevent confusion, it is best to simply ignore whether it's a 12s result or a 14s result and apply the General Rule above: A player's top 8 (singles) and top 8 (doubles 15%) are added together to determine ranking.

Example: Nathan is a 12-year-old boy who played 15 tournaments in the last 12 months scoring the following: 16, 25, 25, 7, **38, 70, 70, 38, 4, 98**, 124 doubles, 21, **38** (played up 14s), **79, 124**. This player now has:

- 555 points toward his 12s singles ranking
- 124 toward his 12s doubles ranking, and
- 38 points toward his 14s ranking.

3. Aging Up: It is not the birth-day but the birth-month that ages a player up. So, if Hannah turns 13 on February 18 and there is a tournament on February 4th, she cannot play in the 12s.

4. 20% Will Follow You: When you age up 20% of your top results will count in your new age category. Using the scenarios above the following would occur: **38** (8), **70** (14), **70** (14), **38** (8), **98** (20), **38** (played up 14s), **79** (16), **124** (25). This player now has:

- 143 points toward her 14s singles ranking
- 0 toward her 14s doubles ranking

Note that 7 scores come from the 12s and 1 from the 14s. Going forward the lowest score is now "8" because of multiplying 38 x .20 and rounding up. If, in the next 14s tournament, 23 points are earned, those 23 points would displace the first score of 8, creating 158 points toward the 14s ranking.

5. National Tournaments: National Levels 1, 2, & 3 tournaments occur all over the nation and count toward your Florida points. However, only 4 of your best Nationals can be used in your top 8 ranking results. This includes 4 of your best doubles National tournaments.

6. Other Opportunities to Earn Ranking Points: The Points Table includes the most common tournaments. There are others throughout the year that can add significant points to a ranking.
